1. **VERIFY YOUR REGISTRATION** and **POLLING PLACE** by calling 1-866-OUR-VOTE.
2. You can vote on **ELECTION DAY** between 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. (if you are in line by 8:00 p.m., you have the right to vote).
3. You do not need to show **IDENTIFICATION** unless you are a first-time voter who registered by mail without submitting identification. However, if you do have identification, it a good idea to have it with you at the polls.
4. You may need to vote using a **PROVISIONAL BALLOT**. Before doing so, have the poll worker verify that you are at the correct precinct. If you are not at the correct precinct, only cast a provisional ballot if you at least in the correct county.
5. If you cannot complete the ballot due to a physical disability or inability to read or write, you have the right to **ASSISTANCE** from any person other than your employer or labor representative.
6. If you have been convicted of a felony **YOU CAN VOTE** if you are no longer incarcerated.
